### Mobile Home Demolition Services

#### **Topic**

This Action Item requests approval to contract with five (5) primary and five (5) contingent vendors to provide timely delivery of Mobile Home Demolition Services. Services include the demolition, removal, and disposal of mobile homes, including the fixtures attached thereto, within the State of Florida for Citizens' policyholders who have sustained total losses from non-catastrophic and catastrophic residential property insurance claims. Approval is requested for a three (3) year base term with one (1) three (3) year optional renewal term, for an amount not to exceed \$1.3 million for the life of the contracts.

### **History**

Florida Statute 319.30 requires Citizens to obtain the title to any mobile/manufactured home that has been determined by a Claims' Adjuster to be a total loss. It is Citizens' responsibility to ensure proper removal and destruction of all mobile/manufactured homes that have been determined to be a total loss. The services include:

- Demolition The systematic, appropriate, and safe destruction of a mobile/manufactured home structure.
- Removal The safe and lawful removal of all mobile/manufactured home debris and remnants from a property.
- Disposal Ensure the safe, proper, and legal disposal of all mobile home debris and remnants in accordance with state and local laws, regulations and/or restrictions.

Citizens is currently contracted with three (3) vendors for Mobile Home Demolition Services. The existing contract (18-18-0026) was approved by the Board on September 26, 2018, for a three (3) year base term and three (3) optional one (1) year renewal terms for a total of \$2,814,048. In March 2023, the Board approved to increase the spend amount to \$27,814,048. The additional funds allowed Citizens to handle the increased volume of mobile home demolition services needed because of Hurricane Ian, as well as to anticipate any daily and/or 2023/2024 catastrophe volume that may arise. To date, \$5,113,948.42 has been spent under the expiring program handling 638 number of assignments.

With the current agreement expiring on October 17, 2024, Citizens posted a Request for Proposals (RFP) No: 23-0019 for Mobile Home Demolition Services on December 4, 2023. Twelve (12) Proposals were independently scored by members of the Evaluation Committee from responsive and responsible Vendors. On April 8, 2024, the Evaluation Committee recommended awarding the following ten (10) Vendors:

#### Primary Contract to:

- Iron Dog, Inc. (Incumbent Vendor)
- Tropical Demolition (Incumbent Vendor)
- JF Gator Construction Co LLC
- Watco
- WHM Services (Incumbent Vendor)



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In addition, on an as needed basis for potential future capacity, secondary Contracts to:

- Miniopolis
- Arwood Site Services
- R&C Construction & Sitework
- Pilar Air Conditioning & Contracting
- Michael McCormick

These new contracts will replace expiring contracts and will continue delivery of mobile home demolition services while increasing the vendor pool to ensure adequate coverage for these services. The same compensation schedule is used across all vendors and was established based upon current contract pricing and inflation.

Due to the unpredictability of a catastrophe, catastrophe-related costs associated with the contracts have not been calculated into the total contract spend requested for approval. Of the approximately \$5,113,948 spent under the current agreement, Citizens paid \$578,956 for 94 non-catastrophe assignments, averaging \$6,159.11 per assignment. As of April 31, 2024, Citizens' mobile home policies in force were 86,208 with a projection that this may increase to 103,000 policies during the term of the new agreement. Using the historical non-catastrophe claims volume and estimated spend with consideration to the projected policies in force, contract spend is not anticipated to exceed \$1.3 million across the base and renewal terms for non-catastrophe claims.

In the event of a catastrophe, the requested Board approved spend could be depleted before the contract life has ended. If this occurs during the life of the contract, Citizens staff will need to seek approval from the Board to seek approval for additional funding.
